Reciprocity?

"A method of inquiry for professionals to reflect on their practices and question the assumptions of the field"

Accurate Cultural Reciprocity requires Cultural

Awareness

This has 3 levels

Overt Awareness

Awareness of obvious differences

Covert Awareness

Awareness of differences not recognized by outward signs

Subtle Awareness

Involves the recognition of embedded values and beliefs that underline our actions and the realization that these beliefs are not universal

Posture of Cultural Reciprocity Steps

Identify cultural values embedded in professional interpretations or recommendation for service

Identify the values of the family being served with respect to your recommendations

Acknowledge and give explicit respect to any cultural differences and fully explain the cultural basis fo the professional assumptions

Through discussion and collaboration, determine the most effective way to adapt professional interpretations and recommendations to the values of the family
